QUALIFICATION CRITERA

To apply for our Scholarship Programme for 2017, interested applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Must be a South African citizen.
- Must be a black (African, Indian or Coloured) male or female.
- 3. Must be a Grade 12 learner in 2017.
- Must have achieved an 85% or higher average across all subjects for Grade 11.
- 5. Must attend a Free State school.
- Parents/guardians must have been exempted from paying school tuition.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The Scholarship Programme is subject to the following Terms and Conditions which should be carefully noted. Non-compliance may lead to disqualification or termination of your scholarship and the return or cancellation of any benefits received.

What Must Be Submitted?

Your application for a Siyandisa Foundation Scholarship must be accompanied by the following documentation:

- A duly completed Application Form signed by the applicant and his/her parent(s) and/or legal guardian(s).
- 2. A copy of the applicant's identity document.
- A copy of the identity document of each parent(s) and/or legal guardian(s).
- 4. Proof of residential address of applicant.
- 5. Copy of final Grade 11 academic results.
- 6. Copy of first term Grade 12 academic results.

Scholarship Phases

A Siyandisa Foundation Scholarship is divided into two phases for which applicants will qualify on successful award of a scholarship.

Phase 1

An initial period that will run from the date of award until the last day of 2017.

Phase 2

A further period that will run from the first day of 2018 until the finalisation of tertiary academic studies by the applicant. An applicant must have successfully completed Phase 1 and met our Terms and Conditions in order to remain part of the Scholarship Programme during Phase 2.

Scholarship Rules

The applicant undertakes the following for the duration of the Scholarship:

- To apply him/herself academically during his/her school or tertiary studies and maintain excellent academic ability and standards.
- 2. To immediately notify Siyandisa Foundation should he/she:
 - 2.1. Be found guilty of any form of misconduct, transgression or offence by a school or tertiary education institution.
 - 2.2. Prematurely terminate academic studies at school or a tertiary education institution.
 - 2.3. Be found guilty of a criminal offence or conduct of a serious nature.
- To use any electronic device and data access received through the scholarship only for the legitimate purposes of the scholarship and no other purpose whatsoever, and allows Siyandisa Foundation the irrevocable right to monitor the use of any such device and/or data access provided.
- 4. The applicant shall not share any information, passwords, access rights, documents, video or other hard copy or electronic resources provided to or to which access is gained through the scholarship to any other person without the express consent of Siyandisa Foundation.
- 5. The applicant shall not be entitled to sell or transfer for benefit any item received under the scholarship to any third party and shall be required to maintain in good condition (fair wear and tear excepted) all items provided to the applicant.
- The applicant must participate and in good faith undertake and avail him/herself for the support, training and counselling activities provided under the scholarship.
- 7. The applicant shall annually, within one month of receiving final academic results for the prior year



of studies, provide Siyandisa Foundation with a copy of such academic results. No payments for which an applicant may qualify, shall be made until such academic results have been received.

- All monetary payments to an applicant shall be paid directly into the nominated bank account of the applicant and must be used for the purposes of furthering the applicant's academic studies.
- 9. The applicant undertakes to comply with the rules and codes of conduct of any education institution at which he/she is studying and not to do anything that may bring the Siyandisa Foundation Scholarship Programme into disrepute.
- 10. The applicant may not cede, assign or transfer any of his/her rights or obligations under the scholarship to any other person without the prior written consent of Siyandisa Foundation.

Consent to Marketing and Media Exposure

By submitting a signed Application Form, the parent(s) and/or legal guardian(s) of the applicant consent to the use by Siyandisa Trust and Siyandisa Foundation of photos and/or details of the applicant for marketing, promotional, advertorial, educational and academic purposes in relation to the Scholarship Progamme and confirm that they understand that such personal information shall be used only for such purposes by Siyandisa Trust and Siyandisa Foundation and for no other purpose whatsoever.

Tertiary Education Bursaries

Upon successful completion of Phase 1 of the scholarship, an applicant will automatically come into consideration for further academic bursaries for both under-graduate and post-graduate studies at an accredited tertiary institution in South Africa or internationally. These bursaries may vary in amount and duration depending on available resources.

Applicants will be informed when they are being considered for further academic bursaries and may be required to submit further information and/or to attend bursary interviews.

To be considered for such academic bursaries applicants must have been accepted at a qualifying tertiary institution, must have excelled academically and must continue to comply with our Terms and Conditions.

Termination of Scholarship

Siyandisa Foundation may terminate any scholarship in the event of any breach of our Terms and Conditions.

Should any applicant wish to terminate their scholarship, it is the applicants responsibility to inform Siyandisa Foundation in writing together with reasons for such termination.

Upon the early termination of the scholarship for whatever reason, the applicant may be required to return any items received under the scholarship and access to and involvement in any support services, tuition and counselling services shall be stopped.

SELECTION PROCESS

- Applications will be evaluated and shortlisted by an Evaluation Panel.
- Shortlisted applicants may be invited to attend an interview with the Evaluation Panel.
- Following any interviews, candidates shall be notified by telephone and email whether they were successful or not.
- 4. No reasons shall be provided in the event that a scholarship is not awarded.
